

ORDINANCE NO. 14

An ordinance requiring a license to be levied on all dogs (male or female) running at large in the Village of Green Isle.

THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GREEN ISLE, SIBLEY COUNTY, MINNESOTA, DO ORDAIN:

SECTION I.—All dogs, male or female, that are not licensed are hereby prohibited from running at large within the limits of this village, from and after the passage and publication of this Ordinance.

SECTION II.—The amount of license to be paid is One Dollar (\$1.00) for a male dog, and Two Dollars (\$2.00) for a female dog per year.

SECTION III.—All dogs have to wear collars and license and the license can be procured from the Village Clerk.

SECTION IV.—It is hereby made the duty of the marshal to kill all dogs found running at large in the village limits that are not licensed.
