

ORDINANCE NO. 21

An ordinance declaring ponds, depressions and places where water accumulates, gathers and remains until the same becomes stagnant, sour and charged with vile odors, within the village of Green Isle, nuisances, and requiring their abatement.

The Village Council of the Village of Green Isle do ordain as follows:

Section 1. All ponds, depressions, and places where water accumulates, gathers and remains until the same becomes stagnant, sour and charged with vile odors, within the village of Green Isle, are hereby declared nuisances and proscribed.

Section No. 2. All persons, co-partnerships, and corporations owning, occupying, using or having control over ponds, depressions, and places where water accumulates, gathers and remains until the same becomes stagnant, sour, and charged with vile odors, within the village of Green Isle, are hereby forthwith required and enjoined to abate such nuisances by draining, ditching or filling them or otherwise so providing that such ponds, depressions and places shall not be subject to the interdiction of section 1 of this ordinance.

Section No. 3. Any person, co-partnership or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor on the conviction of which he or it may be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution in default of payment of which he may be committed to the common jail of the county for a period of not less than ten nor more than ninety days.

Section No. 4. As against any persons, co-partnership or corporation not complying with the provisions of section 2 of this ordinance the Village Council of the Village of Green Isle may in the corporate name begin and maintain an action or actions in any court of competent jurisdiction for the abatement and elimination of the nuisances defined by section 1 of this ordinance and the recovery of any accrued damages and costs in that connection.

Section No. 5. The provisions of any ordinance of the Village of Green Isle inconsistent with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section No. 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
