

ORDINANCE NO. 22

An Ordinance Relating to Nuisances, providing for their abatement and authorizing punishment for violation of the same.

The Village Council of the Village of Green Isle do ordain as follows:

Section 1. No person shall scatter, strew or deposit on any street, alley or public ground of or within the Village of Green Isle any dirt, manure, stones, chips, shavings, garbage, peelings, refuse, substance or thing whether the same be in solid or liquid form, without the express permission of its Village Council or street commissioner.

Section 2. No person shall have, keep, or allow within said Village of Green Isle any offensive, nauseous, or other substances or liquid at any time at any place from which any offensive, unsanitary, or unwholesome stench, odor or smell shall emit or extend from the same to any street, alley, public ground, dwelling, occupied premises, or other space annoyed by the same, and no owner or occupant of any cellar, stable, house, place, out-house, privy, ice-house, ware-house, or other designable place shall suffer or permit the same to be, remain or become nauseous, unsanitary, unhealthful, or otherwise exceptionable, or suffer or permit any foul, unclean, nauseous, offensive, unsanitary, vile, or ill-effective liquid, substance, or thing to pass or flow therefrom over or upon any street, alley, public ground, private way or ground or otherwise.

Section 3. All privies and out-houses within the said Village of Green Isle shall be hereafter constructed or altered and changed so that the same can be cleaned and the offal removed and the offal therein shall not be allowed to accumulate so as to come to the surface of the sub-existing vault or hole or become offensive, unsanitary, or vile, and all persons owning or occupying premises or property within the Village of Green Isle having thereon privies or out-houses shall comply with all directions given them by the Board of Health of the said Village of Green Isle or its Village Council in reference to time and manner of cleaning or disinfecting the same.

Section 4. No person shall stake, pasture, tie, keep or herd any live stock, cattle, sheep, hogs, or other animals on, or in a way or manner that they or any of them may feed, lie, stand, or otherwise exist on, or each any public street, alley or public ground within the Village of Green Isle.

Section 4. No person shall stake, pasture, tie, keep or herd any live stock, cattle, sheep, hogs, or other animals on, or in a way or manner that they or any of them may feed, be, stand, or otherwise exist on, or reach any public street, alley or public ground within the Village of Green Isle.

Section 5. No person shall allow or permit any building or structure owned or occupied by him within the Village of Green Isle to become, be or remain in such condition, state of repair or otherwise either on account of its contents, use, management, or keeping or because of its original or delapidated condition, that the same be a fire menace, easily susceptible to fire origin or danger or otherwise as naturally to provide ready means for catching, originating or spreading fire or danger of fire damage.

Section 6. Any person violating any provision or injunction of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and adjudged to pay a fine of not less than five and no-100ths dollars, nor more than one hundred and no-100ths dollars and cost of prosecution in default of payment of which he may be committed to the Jail of Sibley County, Minnesota, for the period of not less than five, nor more than ninety days; provided that nothing in this ordinance contained shall be held or construed to enjoin or prevent the Village of Green Isle from abating any nuisance, thing, or act proscribed by the same by civil action or otherwise as in the judgment of its Village Council may be determined.

Section 7. The provision of any ordinance existing, if any, contrary to or at variance with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption and publication.
