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Section II.

(Application for Permits)

(A) All applications for the introduction of water into any premises, or for the extension of any water pipes, shall be made by the owner, or tenant with the written consent of the owner, upon blanks printed for that purpose to be had at the Village Clerk's office.

(B) The applicants must subscribe and agree to be bound by such rules governing the use of the water, as may be in force at the time or be made from time to time by the Village Council. A permit will then be issued by the Village Clerk authorizing any duly licensed plumber to make the desired connections with the mains.

(C) A special permit must be issued for every service connection, for each building, residence, business place, etc., also for each branch connected when more than one connection is made by one service pipe.

(D) A special permit must also be issued for making any extensions or alterations to the plumbing of any house, store or building, beyond that for which permission may already have been granted.

(E) No two or more premises will be allowed to receive their water supply from the same service pipe, where only one service and stop cock is used.

(F) Where a water connection is made to any building occupied by more than one business or profession, a meter is used, each business or profession shall be required to pay the cost of the use of water then in

(B) Where one service pipe is intended to supply two or more separate and distinct premises or tenements, and where only one service cock is used, the application must be made by the person or persons controlling the same and who must pay the water rent of all the parties who are thus supplied, as separate water bills will not be made.

(C) Persons taking water must keep their service pipes and all fixtures connected herewith in good repair, and protected from frost at their own expense.

(D) The Village will put in all service pipes, corporation cocks, and stop cocks from the street main to the outer edge of the lot line adjoining the main, and the cost thereof shall be charged to the applicant; the length of the pipe shall be taken as one-half of the width of the street irrespective of the location of the main. The cost of the service pipe, stop cock, corporation cock and the laying of the same shall be the average actual cost not to exceed Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) when only one stop cock is used; if more than one stop cock is used, an additional charge of the actual cost thereof will be charged.

SECTION VI.

Hose.

The right is reserved to suspend the use of fountains and hose for sprinkling gardens, yards, etc., whenever in the opinion of the Village Council the public exigency may require it and in case of an alarm of fire, the use of hose is positively forbidden except for fire purposes.

Section VII.

(A) Any plumber or pipefitter wishing to do business in connection with the Village waterworks, shall file in the office of the Village Clerk his petition in writing, giving the name of the firm and of each member thereof, the place of business and asking to become a licensed plumber or pipefitter in connection with said water works, stating his willingness and consent to be governed in all respects by the rules and regulations of said water works, and every plumber or pipefitter shall be subject to and conform to all and singular the rules and regulations herein contained which may hereafter be adopted.

(B) Before receiving a license the applicant shall execute and deposit in the office of the Village Clerk a bond with two or more sureties to be approved by the common council, in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, conditioned that he will indemnify and save harmless the Village of Green Isle from all accidents and damages caused by any negligence in performing this work, or by any unfaithful or inadequate work done by virtue of his license, and that he will also restore and replace the pavement over any excavations made to lay ser-

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...case at or within... of the hub.

Section X.

Excavations.

(A) In making excavations in the streets or highways for the laying of service pipes or making repairs, all planks, paving stones and earth removed, must be deposited in a manner that will occasion the least inconvenience to the public and provide for the passage of water along the gutters.

(B) No person shall leave any excavations made in any street or highway or alley open at any time without barricades, and during the night warning lights must be maintained at such excavations.

(C) The streets and pavements immediately upon completion of the work must be restored to as good condition as it was previous to the making of the excavations. Should any excavation in any street or alley be left open or unfinished for a period of twenty-four hours, or should the work be improperly done, the village council shall have the right to finish or correct the same, and the expense thus incurred shall be charged to the plumber whose work is finished or correct, and shall be paid by said plumber before receiving further permits.

(D) No connections shall be made with the mains during freezing weather unless approved by the Village Council.

Section XI.

Management of Water Works.

(A) All records pertaining to the management of said water works shall be kept by the Village Clerk in books provided for that purpose; such records must show the names of all patrons, description of premises supplied, collections made and such other items as the Council may from time to time require.

Section XII.

All fines, penalties and water rates collected in accordance with this ordinance shall be placed to the credit of the water works fund.

Section XIII.

(A) No connection to the water works system shall be made to any premises which have been platted to lots and or blocks unless all of the lot or block described in the petition are located within the corporate limits of said Village.

Section XIV.

(A) The owner or occupant of premises with said water works system shall under no circumstances permit others to use water from such premises unless a meter is installed.

Section XV.

This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its adoption and publication.
