

An Ordinance Relating to the Sale of Non-intoxicating Malt Liquors.
The Village Council of the Village of Green Isle, Sibley County, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Non-intoxicating malt liquor (within the meaning of this ordinance shall be held to be any malt liquor or beverage which contains one-half of one percentum or more of alcohol by weight. The Prohibition Law shall include any law or ordinance relating to the sale of intoxicating liquor.

Section 2. No person shall vend, or deal in any non-intoxicating malt liquor without first having obtained a license so to do from the Village Council.

Section 3. The annual license fee is for an "On Sale" license shall be \$50.00 and for an "Off Sale" license shall be \$5.00.

Section 4. No person shall sell non-intoxicating malt liquor to any person under twenty-one years of age.

Section 5. The Village Council may grant or deny any such application and if the same be granted may be revoked by the Village Council at any time without a hearing and without notice to the licensee.

Section 6. No "On Sale" license shall be issued to an applicant unless he actually conducts the place where he intends to sell such malt liquor. The Applicant shall personally be in the place of business at least six hours each day.

Section 7. The license of any person who shall be found guilty of any violation of the Prohibition laws, whether the offense be committed on the premises named in his license or elsewhere, and the license of any person who shall have, keep, sell, manufacture or possess in intoxicating liquor at or upon the premises named in his license contrary to said Prohibition Law, shall be revoked by the Village Council.

Section 8. No "On Sale" license shall be issued to any person who does not have a food license under the provisions of the State Law providing for preservation of health and the suppression of disease and for the inspection, regulation and licensing of hotels, restaurants, boarding houses, inns, taverns, meat markets mercantile establishments, and any place offering for sale and selling any food or drink.

Section 9. Any person desiring to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor under license as hereinafter defined, shall make application in writing to the Village Council which written application shall contain the name and address of the Applicant, and whether or not the applicant is a citizen of the United States of America. Such application shall be signed by the applicant, and the license fee shall accompany the application, and describing place for which it is desired.

Section 10. The premises named in any license shall at all times while open to the public be also open to inspection and examination by any police or health officer of the Village. No curtains, screens, blinds, or advertising matter shall be placed on the doors or windows of the premises having an "On Sale" license so that the view is obstructed from the outside. between the hours of

Section 11. No sale of either "Off" or "On" Sale license can be made after Eleven O'clock P. M. and Six O'clock A. M. or on any Election Day.

Section 12. No Manufacturer of malt beer may sell or deliver to any Retail Customer or any one in the Village limits that does not hold a Village license.

Section 13. No noise or disorder of any kind shall be allowed in any place holding license under this Ordinance, and no school children shall be allowed to loiter in such places holding license to sell malt beer.

Section 14. Above licenses are not transferable, and conviction for violation of the Prohibition Law automatically cancels the license.

Section 15. "Off Sale" Licenses are restricted to the Business District, defined as: between the N. & St. L. R. R. Tracks and the Village Hall on Parnell and McGrann Streets. No person shall be granted license to operate in any resident home.

Section 16. All "On Sale" licenses shall expire on June 30th after issuance. All "Off Sale" licenses shall expire on the first Monday in April after issuance.

Section 17. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than one Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or imprisonment for not more than
