

ORDINANCE NO. 69
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND
REGULATING THE SUNDAY SALE OF INTOXICATING
LIQUOR AND AMENDING ORDINANCE 56 ACCORDINGLY

The City Council of Green Isle, Minnesota, does ordain:

Section I. Special License Required. The Council of the City of Green Isle may issue special licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors at "on sale" on Sundays to any establishments already holding or hereafter holding regular "On Sale" licenses from the City of Green Isle and which are hotels or restaurants as defined by Section 340.07 of Minnesota Statutes, and which establishments have facilities for serving not less than 30 guests at one time.

Section II. Application for License. Application for a special "Sunday Sale" license shall be made to the City Council in the same manner as application for regular "On Sale" licenses.

Section III. License Fee. The fee for a special Sunday sales of intoxicating liquor license shall be \$200.00 per annum, payable upon presentation of the application. Each license shall be issued for a period of one year, except that if a portion of the license year has elapsed when the application is made, a license may be issued for a pro rata fee. In computing such fee, any unexpired fraction of a month shall be counted as one month.

Section IV. Hours of Sunday Sales. Such establishments may serve intoxicating liquors on Sunday between the hours of 12:00 noon and 11:00 P. M. in conjunction with the serving of food.

Section V. Penalty. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or imprisonment in the County Jail for not more than 90 days or both, plus the costs of prosecution in either case.

Section VI. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication.

The City Council of Green Isle, Minnesota, does ordain:

Section I. Special License Required. Each license shall be issued for a period of one year, except that if a portion of the license year has elapsed when the application is made, a license may be issued for a pro rata fee. In computing such fee, any unexpired fraction of a month shall be counted as one month.

Section IV. Hours of Sunday Sales. Such establishments may serve intoxicating liquors on Sunday between the hours of 12:00 noon and 11:30 p.m. in conjunction with the serving of food. In addition, such establishments shall be evacuated of all customers by 12:00 midnight.

Section V. Penalty. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or imprisonment in the County Jail for not more than 90 days or both, plus the costs of prosecution in either case.

Section VII. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication. Passed by the Council this 12th day of February, 1979.

(4) Said newspaper is circulated in and near the municipality which it purports to serve, has at least 500 copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers, has an average of at least 75 percent of its total circulation currently paid or no more than three months in arrears and has entry as second-class matter in its local post-office. (5) Said newspaper purports to serve the City of Arlington in the County of Sibley and it has its known office of issue in the City of Arlington in said county, established and open during regular business hours for the gathering of news, sale of advertisements and sale of subscriptions and maintained by the publisher of said newspaper or persons in his employ and subject to his direction and control during all such regular business hours and at which said newspaper is printed. (6) Said newspaper files a copy of each issue immediately with the State Historical Society. (7) Said newspaper has complied with all the foregoing conditions for at least two years preceding the day or dates of publication mentioned below. (8) Said newspaper has filed with the Secretary of State of Minnesota prior to January 1, 1966, and each signed by the publisher an affidavit in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State and that the newspaper is a legal newspaper.
