

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING AND PROHIBITING CERTAIN PUBLIC NUISANCES
WITHIN THE CITY OF GREEN ISLE

The City Council of the City of Green Isle hereby ordains:

In the interest of the public health and safety, and to guarantee the peaceful and reasonable enjoyment of property rights by the citizens of Green Isle, the City Council hereby declares that the following described conduct is a public nuisance and shall be a violation of the law.

Section 1. Any person who keeps or harbors a pet or other animal, or allows another to keep or harbor a pet or other animal on his property, in the case where the pet or other animal is of such a nature or disposition or is kept in such confinement or condition that the animal disrupts the peace of neighboring property owners by emitting barking or other noises at late night hours or in a continuous or persistent manner, shall be considered as maintaining a public nuisance.

Section 2. Any person who causes or allows loud music or other disturbing noises to originate from his property in an unreasonable manner or at unreasonable hours which would tend to alarm or disturb the peace and tranquillity of his neighbors shall be guilty of creating or maintaining a public nuisance. Noise or music sources located on the yard or other portions of the property outside the structures of a person's property after the hour of 1:00 a.m. in the morning shall be considered prima facie a public nuisance.


Section 3. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$700.00 and/or imprisonment of not more than thirty days in jail. Each incident which constitutes a public nuisance occurring on a separate day or at a separate location shall be considered a separate offense, and each such offense shall be punishable by a separate penalty as described herein.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon publication.

(3) Said newspaper has 50 percent of its news columns devoted to news of local interest to the community which it purports to serve and does not wholly duplicate any other publication and is not made up entirely of patents, plate matter and advertisements. (4) Said newspaper is circulated in and near the municipality which it purports to serve, has at least 500 copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers, has an average of at least 75 percent of its total circulation currently paid or no more than three months in arrears and has entry as second-class matter in its local post-office. (5) Said newspaper purports to serve the City of Arlington in the County of Sibley and it has its known office of issue in the City of Arlington in said county, established and open during regular business hours for the gathering of news, sale of advertisements and sale of subscriptions and maintained by the publisher of said newspaper or persons in her employ and subject to her direction and control during all such regular business hours and at which said newspaper is printed. (6) Said newspaper files a copy of each issue immediately with the State Historical Society. (7) Said newspaper has complied with all the foregoing conditions for at least two years preceding the day or dates of publication mentioned below. (8) Said newspaper has filed with the Secretary of State of Minnesota prior to January 1, 1966, and each January 1 thereafter an affidavit in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State and signed by the publisher of said newspaper and sworn to before a notary public stating that the newspaper is a legal newspaper.
