ORDINANCE 94

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE STORAGE OF PROPERTY IN OPEN YARD AREAS WITHIN THE CITY OF GREEN ISLE

The City Council of the City of Green Isle hereby ordains:

Section 1. The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the storage of property in areas of the city visible to the general public, in a manner designed to protect and promote the health and welfare of the public, and to maintain property values.

Section 2. No motor vehicles designed to operate on public highways which are either inoperable or unlicensed or which are both inoperable and unlicensed shall be stored on any private property within the City of Green Isle for a period of more than 30 days, unless stored in a building, or surrounded by a fence or other enclosure as approved by the City Council to keep said vehicle, regardless of condition, shall be parked or stored at any time on front lawns in residential areas. No motor vehicle, regardless of condition, shall be parked or stored at any time on back lawns in residential areas. No motor vehicles, motor homes and boat trailers, which may be stored on backyard areas in a neat and orderly fashion in cases where the owner does not have sufficient garage or driveway space to store such recreational vehicle.

Section 3. No used furniture, appliances, inoperable equipment, garbage, or other refuse shall be kept or stored outside of an enclosed building or garbage disposal containers within the City of Green Isle.

Section 4. During construction or repair of property within the city ilmits, building materials shall be stacked or stored in a neat and orderly fashion, and in a manner so as to avoid presenting any danger to the general public. Refuse building materials shall be neatly piled or stored in garbage disposal con-

tainers. All building materials and refuse shall be cleared from the construction project no later than 90 days after completion of the construction or repair.

Section 6. Any violator who served with a 15 day warning not under Section 5 above, who respot to such notice by moving the i which is in violation to a new local within city limits which is also violation of the ordinance, shall considered to be in continued vition, and the original 15 day warr notice grace period shall continurum in the same manner as if violator had not moved the item fithe original location.

Section 7. Any person viola any provision of this ordinance is be charged with a misdemeal punishable by fine or as much \$700.00 and/or imprisonment for ore than 90 days.
