Sibley County Public Health adds two Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine clinics in February for children ages 5-11

Sibley County Public Health and Human Services is offering two Pfizer COVID vaccine clinics for children ages 5 – 11 in February in conjunction with the State of Minnesota’s *Give Kids a Shot!* campaign. Minnesota families who get their kids 5-11 years old fully vaccinated in January and February can get a \$200 Visa gift card. In order to be eligible, Minnesotans 5-11 must receive their first **and** second dose between January 1 and February 28, 2022. Later this spring, there will be drawings for five \$100,000 Minnesota college scholarships for all Minnesotans 5-11 years old who are fully vaccinated. Minnesota families must self-register through the State of Minnesota for these incentive opportunities.

Pre-registration is required to guarantee your vaccine dose. Register online at the Sibley County website: www.co.sibley.mn.us . To register by phone during the times listed below, call 507-237-7830. Registering by phone may result in longer wait times.
