*Sibley County Public Health offers additional COVID vaccine clinic opportunities*

Sibley County Public Health and Human Services has released dates for March COVID-19 Moderna vaccine clinics. The influenza vaccine is also available. All clinics are located at the Sibley County Service Center, 111 8<sup>th</sup> St., Gaylord. Pre-registration is required to guarantee your vaccine dose. Online registration can be found on the Sibley County website. Please bring your original vaccination card to your booster dose appointment.

**Who is currently eligible for a COVID-19 booster shot?**

Everyone 12 years and older who is fully vaccinated against COVID-19 is eligible for a booster. Pfizer is currently the only COVID vaccine authorized for 12-17 year olds. This age group is eligible for a booster dose at least 5 months after receiving their initial vaccine series. All adults 18 and older that received a Johnson & Johnson vaccine should get a booster shot two months after their single dose. All adults 18 and older that received the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine should get a booster shot 5 months after their initial series.
